From the Grounds Crew

The rain can stop anytime. We have already had close to ten inches of rain fall on the course in May alone. All the extra rain/moisture causes many headaches that are easy to see such as the washed-out sand traps, long clumpy rough, muddy tracks left by carts, and everyone's favorite, slow greens.

There are also some unseen problems that the saturated ground can lead to. The wet soil will compact from the cart traffic much easier and often the damage will not be seen until much later in the year. This is why it is very important to use the cart paths whenever possible and keep all four tires on the asphalt.

Many of the turf diseases thrive in moist conditions which will lead to poor turf quality as well as additional chemical costs. The most problematic result of the rain will be the lack of root growth in the turf. Spring is when the grass grows the roots that help with water and nutrient uptake. If the ground is too wet the roots will not grow very long. If the roots don't grow long enough the turf will become droughty looking in the middle of summer. This will cause us to water more frequently just to keep the grass alive until it starts to regrow roots in the fall. Let's just hope for a drier June and many of these potential problems might just be avoided.

Hope to see everyone on the course enjoying the summer.

A Note From The Board

Dear Members,

We are excited to announce the opening of our new warm-up practice range, designed specifically to help you prepare for your rounds of golf. This range is limited to irons only, providing an excellent opportunity to fine-tune your short and mid-range game before heading out on the course.

Practice area baskets and range balls will be available at the golf shop.

Please note that due to various factors, the practice range will not be open beyond 7 PM on most days. We appreciate your understanding and cooperation in adhering to these hours.

As part of our commitment to fostering young talent, we have established specific guidelines for junior members using the new warm-up practice range:

- Usage Limit: Junior members are limited to one bucket of balls per day.

- Supervision: Children under 15 must be accompanied by an adult while using the practice range.

- Unsupervised Use: The practice range is not intended for unsupervised use by those under the age of 15.

These measures are in place to ensure a safe and enjoyable experience for all.

Thank you for your continued support, and we look forward to seeing you on the range and the course.

A reminder of the Club's dress code:

The dress code intends to ensure that all members, their families, and guests enjoy the Club in a pleasant atmosphere and help sustain the quality of membership and standard of excellence upon which Stoughton Country Club was established.

Proper attire while at Stoughton Country Club is not only important in the clubhouse but also on the golf course and surrounding areas of the club. When members and guests arrive at the Club not in compliance with the dress code it is not the intent to embarrass or harass the member or guest. The following day they will receive a phone call from the general manager reminding them of the dress code requirements for their next visit.

Dining room expectations:

"Casual" attire is permitted for dining throughout the clubhouse at all times. Casual attire includes golf clothes, and denim jeans "in good repair" (free of holes, tears, and un-tattered. Hats, caps, and hoodies are prohibited.

Golf course recommended attire:

Men and Boys:

Dress shirts, collared golf shirts, or sport shirts with sleeves, turtlenecks, mock turtlenecks, sweaters and sweater vests, golf jackets, golf shorts, Bermuda shorts, walking shorts (mid-thigh length), traditional slacks, and khakis. Hats and caps should be worn with the bill facing forward.

Women and Girls:

Sleeved or sleeveless blouses, shirts or golf shirts with or without a collar, turtlenecks, mock turtlenecks, sweaters, sweater vests, jackets and golf jackets and pullovers, golf shorts, Bermuda shorts, walking shorts (mid-thigh length), golf skirts, skorts, capri pants, golf slacks, and golf dresses. Hats and caps should be worn with the bill facing forward.

Attire To Avoid:

- T-shirts (plain, logoed, or athletic)
- Hoodies
- Gym shorts, short shorts, workout attire
- Cotton collarless t-shirts
- · Basic tank tops, halter tops, or midriff tops
- · Cargo shorts/pants, carpenter's pants, and sweatpants
- Denim jeans
- · Excessively large or inappropriate logos on clothing

• Mini skirts (except for appropriate tennis skirts used as a crossover for golf). Our standard is set by the typical length of golf shorts/skorts.

The above items are not permitted on the golf course, practice area, or putting green. You will be asked to return with a collared shirt (or other appropriate attire), or you may purchase appropriate clothing from the golf shop. Golf shop staff will be responsible for determining what is or is not appropriate when members and guests arrive for golf.

Members are asked to not only willingly comply with the dress code but to make family members and guests aware of the dress code and ensure that they comply. The dress code will be administered by the golf shop staff, the restaurant service manager, and the bartenders, under the guidance of the general manager.

Stoughton Country Club strives to provide an enjoyable dining and golfing environment for all members and guests.
